



## **Evolution of Canadian Immigration Policy**


- In 1967, Canada formally de-racialized its immigration system.
- · Since the late 1980's it has emphasized economic immigration and encouraged multiculturalism.

### 1940s **EARLY COMMUNITY-BASED SERVICES** Delivered primarily by a 1950 network of non-profit THE CITIZENSHIP agencies **BRANCH** Created at the federal 1974 level to spread awareness on citizenship **IMMIGRANT SETTLEMENT** & ADAPTATION PROGRAM Launched as the permanent 1990s service provider of FEDERAL INTEGRATION Language Instruction for Newcomers in Canada **STRATEGY** Developed to delegate 2010immigrant settlement services to provincial bodies **CANADIAN IMMIGRANT INTEGRATION PROGRAM** Formed to provide pre-
