
- Understanding impact of social stigma on help-seeking behaviours for substance use disorder
- Recommend solutions to address stigma, enhance help-seeking






1 in 2 respondents with a history of substance use disorder (SUD) experience moderate to severe depression symptoms.




Quantitative Findings


- Seven stigma-related variables affect help-seeking for mental health/ substance use (Statistics Canada, 2023)
- Embarrassment, fear, and being insulted for substance use more common for those not seeking help
