


Variation in Help-Seeking by Marital Status

-- Married individuals show higher need, seeking, and receiving rates.

Implication

- Marital status influences help-seeking.
- Gaps in understanding for separated, divorced, and widowed individuals.
- Societal, and cultural factors affecting behaviors.

Education's Impact on Help-Seeking

- High school diploma holders show the highest need and seeking rates. - University diploma holders show the lowest seeking and receiving rates.

Implication

- Education level affects seeking and receiving help.
- Varying patterns across different education levels.


Understanding the Relationship between Sex by Birth and Professional Help Seeking

- Males exhibit higher percentages across all


Implication

Understanding the Relationship between Employment Level and Professional Help

Implication Employment's Influence on Help-Seeking Work environment influences Employees exhibit significantly higher need, help-seeking. seeking, and receiving rates. Access to healthcare and resources 87% 87%



Recommendation:

- Invest in telehealth infrastructure and mobile clinics to reach remote areas.
- Allocate resources for the continuous evaluation of targeted interventions. Use data-driven insights to refine strategies and maximize impact.
- Extend the research to rural and remote regions for a comprehensive understanding.
- Include marginalized populations to ensure equitable representation. .
